✓ CHECK THE INFO BASE

Safety first - the most important information like the avalanche danger and more you will receive at the Freeride Info Base in front of the Alpincenter

✓ CHECK THE TERRAIN

- Never ride alone and never in unknown terrain!
- Bad visibility – abandon your ride!
- In slopes with 30° steepness: at least 30m gap between each rider!
- In slopes with over 35° steepness: ride one at a time!
- Clearly decide where the next meeting place is. Choose a safe spot in the terrain!
- Keep a look out for dangerous places and wind drifts!

✓ CHECK THE EQUIPMENT

- Safety equipment: Helmet, avalanche beacon, shovel, probe, First aid packet and mobile phone
- Batteries in the beacon?
- Check your beacon at the Info Base!

✓ CHECK THE INFOPOINTS

At the beginning of each route you will find a Freeride Info Point with a topographical map of the terrain. There is a photo of the Kitzsteinhorn on this map showing the steepness of the inclines in different colours. Therefore, you can determine the steepness of each route.
The higher the avalanche danger, the flatter the slopes must be for freeriders. Look at the avalanche danger level!

✓ CHECK THE AVALANCHE TRAINING CENTER

The Kitzsteinhorn Avalanche Training Center, for lessons in the use of avalanche beacons, is just above the Alpincenter. Here you can practice using beacons the correct way, under realistic circumstances. The training area is self explanatory, free of charge and without any preparation time.

WHERE, HOW, WHEN?
PLACE | 100 m above the Alpincenter. Easily reached with skis or board by the ICE CAMP.
PRICE | use of the training area is free of charge
EQUIPMENT | take your own beacon and avalanche probe
TIMES | open daily when Kitzsteinhorn is operating
GROUPS | trainings for groups on inquiry
